## N.6: Five RRCAT scientists presented gold medals by Prime Minister

The Training School of the Atomic Energy Establishment was started in 1957 at Bombay. It completed its 50 years this year. To mark this occasion, a special Golden Jubilee function was held at Central Complex Auditorium of BARC, Mumbai, on Aug. 31, 2007, coinciding with the graduation function of the 50<sup>th</sup> batch of BARC Training School. In this function, overall toppers of 1<sup>st</sup> to 45<sup>th</sup> batches were given Homi Bhabha Medals by the Hon. Prime Minister, Dr. Manmohan Singh, who was the Chief Guest. Five scientists from RRCAT received the gold medals in this function from the Prime Minister. These overall batch toppers are: Dr. V. C. Sahni (8<sup>th</sup> batch, Physics), Dr. P. D. Gupta (16<sup>th</sup> batch, Physics), Dr. Prasad A. Naik (25<sup>th</sup> batch, Physics), and Shri Tushar Puntambekar (31<sup>st</sup> batch, Electronics).

In the afternoon session, toppers in the individual disciplines of the first 45 batches were presented gold medals by present (Dr. Anil Kakodkar) and ex-Chairmen of AEC: Dr. Homi Sethna, Shri M. R. Srinivasan, and Dr. P. K. Iyengar. Four RRCAT scientists received the medals. These include: Dr. Manoranjan Prasad Singh (33rd batch, Physics), Shri Mangesh Borage (38th batch, Electrical), Shri Prashant Khanzode (40<sup>th</sup> batch, Electronics, Ex-staff), and Amit Chauhan (43<sup>rd</sup> batch, Electronics). Four other RRCAT related subject toppers could not attend this function. These were: Dr. V. Selvakumar (28th batch, Physics, Ex-staff), Dr. Vinit Kumar (37th batch, Physics), Dr. Tarun Kumar Sharma (38th batch, Physics), and Dr. S. Anantha Ramakrishna (39th batch, Physics, Ex-staff). It may be added that from 46<sup>th</sup> batch onwards, Homi Bhabha Medals have been awarded during the respective graduation functions.

The significance of BARC Training School to RRCAT is reflected from the fact that most of the senior scientists and engineers at RRCAT are from BARC Training School.
