Yes or No.	Yes, they are given one year orientation training in BARC Training School, RRCAT as per the approved syllabus. According to their discipline, foundation and elective courses are different for Engineers and Physicists.

In the light of DoPT OM F.No.14014/02/2012-Estt.(D) dated 16/01/2013 - Compassionate appointment can be made only upto 5% of the vacancies falling under direct recruitment quota in Group"C" posts (including erstwhile "D" posts) in a recruitment year.
8.	Whether percentage of people engaged permanently in compassionate ground are calculated cadre wise or calculated on the basis of total sanctioned positions.	Not exceeding 5% of the direct recruitment of Group C posts in a recruitment year.

RTI applicant desired to know the criteria of eye power site for the post of trainee, scientist/scientific officer or the post required diploma and degree in engineering in all BARC units/department/R and D/organisation or any of units under DAE.	For Scientist/Scientific Officer of RRCAT, level of myopia shall not exceed +8.00 D and total Hypermetropia shall not exceed +6.00 in case of candidates above 22 years of age and -6.00 D and +6.00 D respectively in case of those up to age of 20 years. Fundus examination is to be done and any progressive pathology is considered while determining fitness. Colour Vision is not a disqualification but person can join with caution of not to be employed anywhere where colour differentiation is required.
